All of the subordinates had held their regular meetings, with Christmas parties, gifts for the needy, and card parties and other activities. Reports were heard about the installation at Lexington Grange by Dale Teeter and installing team from Ontario and the degree in lone.

Mikkalo reported that they are still a grange but are in the act of disbanding, with some members transferring to other granges and some dropping.

The legislative report was by Kenneth Smouse, who stated that Congress is again in session and is considering farm bills. Recently three states went together and held a joint Wheat League meeting, and much emphasis was on environment and the disposal of different types of garbage. Recently at the farm forum in Spokane several spoke on disposal materials, one of them being crank case oil, which is not supposed to be poured on the ground.

The agriculture chairman Lewis Halvorsen reported that it is sign-up time at the ASCS office and that

there are several meetings of interest to farmers. A meeting will be held Jan. 31 at Willows Grange Hall with diner at noon and a chemical meeting at Willows Grange Hall Feb. 9 by a chemical company. This is especially interesting to the farmers who apply their own chemicals, as this will help with the renewal of the applicators license. G.W.A., chairman Dot Halvorsen reported on the reports she's received and that the ladies of all the granges are working hard on the various projects.

A resolution committee was appointed of Lewis Halvorsen, Barton Clark and Kenneth Smouse.

A delicious dinner was enjoyed at noon after which the group held a cakewalk. The program was held with a reading "God made each special", food for thought by Joyce Buchanan and a short talk by the Morrow County Judge, Louis Carlson on the county budget. Stan Foster of CAPECO answered questions and gave a report on CAPECO (Community Action Programs in Eastern Oregon). Foster is the Eastern Oregon director of CAPECO. This program is geared for the needs of low income families and the elderly, including weather-proofing homes, utility bills, food distribution, help for the homeless and women with small children. This is one of the ways that our tax dollar is returned to the communities. One of the things stressed was the need to put Americans to work and have fewer welfare programs. Education for young mothers is important so that they might be able to work and finance their own lives. Another in-

teresting program is yard work in the summers, especially for the elderly. The people hired to do these various jobs are hired locally, if possible, keeping the money in the area. Judge Carlson also told of wood available for those needing it. Anyone needing wood may call the judge's office.

A certificate of membership was presented to Wilma Martin by Mikalo member Annabelle Yeager.

The meeting was again in session with a report from the resolution committee including thanks to Willows for the dinner and hospitality; a resolution against benefits for past U.S. presidents and spouses; a resolution to keep the Oregon State University as an agriculture college, with more majors in that field. All were approved by the committee and by the body.

Verla Larson spoke of the contests available through the G.W.A. group and especially the sewing contest which will this year be on a state level and not national. There have been changes in the needlecraft contest. There will be a G.W.A. conference Feb. 16 at Willows Grange starting at 10:30 and all grange ladies are urged to attend. By attending these meetings members learn about all the activities available to grange members.

Plans were made for a fifth degree initiation day with a committee of Dot Halvorsen, Eulenna Vaughn, Delpha Jones and Barton Clark appointed to get this underway.
