Those who live inside the city limits will present their water billing card to the landfill attendant. If you can't find it, please, plan ahead and pick up a pass at the City Hall. If your water bill is paid by another party you may pick up a pass. Users with no card or pass will be considered outside users.

The City Council agreed that the way to identify a flatbed truck will be anything with dual wheels on the back. A pickup size or smaller trailer behind a car or other vehicle is not considered a truck.

Willow Creek Dam propose hiking trail

On April 4, local representatives from Heppner Economic Development Center, Heppner Garden Club, Willow Creek Park District, Resource and Conservation Development and Heppner Chamber of Commerce met with the Morrow Soil and Water Conservation District to discuss the Oregon Youth Conservation Corp grant received from the Oregon Department of Natural Resource Division for a hiking trail near the Willow Creek Dam Reservoir.

The trail is to connect the Willow Creek Dam with the town of Heppner so that the community can benefit from its use. The hiking trail proposed would allow people to walk from downtown to the proposed swimming area and the proposed RV Park. Four or five local teenagers would be hired to build the trail for eight weeks starting sometime in June.

On April 10, the Morrow Soil and Water Conservation made the same presentation to the Heppner Chamber of Commerce. They were shown a video of the proposed area and given information on what it will take to be completed.
