**Harlan McCurdy**

The funeral for Harlan D. McCurdy Jr. was April 16 at the Hope Lutheran Church in Heppner. Concluding service and burial followed at the Heppner Masonic Cemetery. Mr. McCurdy, 71, of Heppner, died Thursday, April 12, 1990 at his home.

Survivors include his wife, at the home; daughters, Diane, (Mrs. Bruce) Moyer of Lolo, Mont., Karen (Mrs. Doug) Dubuque of Heppner and Janet (Mrs. John) Currin of Pendleton; his mother Della McCurdy of Heppner; sister Maxine (Mrs. Len) Gilman of Dulzura, Calif. and five grandchildren.
