Ione track teams compete at invitationals

The Ione track teams made two showings last week, traveling to the Pilot Rock Invitational on Tuesday and the Sherman County Invitational on Saturday. The Sherman County meet was held at Wahtonka High School in The Dalles.

On Tuesday, the Cardinals competed against nine other schools at Pilot Rock. Official team results and times were not available at press time. Jo Cupps paced the girls team with a win in the discus and javelin. Danielle Stefani was the only other

first place winner, running to a win in the 1500 meters. She also took second in the 3000 meters. Wendy Anderson was third in the shot put and Janie Cupps grabbed second place in the high jump, fourth in the 400 and sixth in the 800.

In boys' results, Gabe Garcia sprinted to second place finishes in the 100 and 400 and added a third place in the 400. Mike Garrett was second in the javelin and sixth in the 1500. Mark Anderson was fourth in the javelin and Mac Lovett was sixth in the 100 meters.

According to Coach Del LaRue, the Cardinals enjoyed good weather but didn't see many good times due to Pilot Rock's cinder track.

The Cardinals ran up against fifteen teams at the Sherman County Invitational Saturday. The girls finished in sixth place as a team with 41 points and the boys scored 36 points to place seventh. Wahtonka won the girls portion of the meet with 137 points and Klickitat (WA) High School won the boys division with 107 points.

Mike Garrett led the Cardinal boys, winning the javelin with a throw of 148'0", a personal best. Garrett has improved his javelin best by 18 feet since last Saturday. He also finished second in the 3000 with a time of 11:30.27, fourth in the 1500 in 4:52.15 and fourth in the triple jump with a leap of 35'6". Gabe Garcia was second in the 400 with a time of 54.53 and Mac Lovett placed fifth in the 100 in 12.14. Gabe Garcia did not place in the 200 but had a personal record running 23.88.

On the girls side, Jo Cupps won the javelin with a throw of 120'2", a personal record. She also took second in the discus with a toss of 94'11". Danielle Stefani lowered her personal record in the 3000 by 16 seconds, running 12:16.73 and placing second. She also took third in the 1500 meters in 5:32.57. Janie Cupps took fourth in the high jump with a jump of 4'6" and Wendy Anderson was fourth in the shot put with a throw of 28'4".

Coach Del LaRue said he was pleased with the efforts, especially since the athletes were competing in a stiff wind. He said that he is seeing continued improvement from the team.

This weekend, the Cardinals who have met the qualifying standards will travel to the State B Invitational track meet at Mt. Hood Community College. This meet gives the "B" schools a chance to compete against schools their own size.

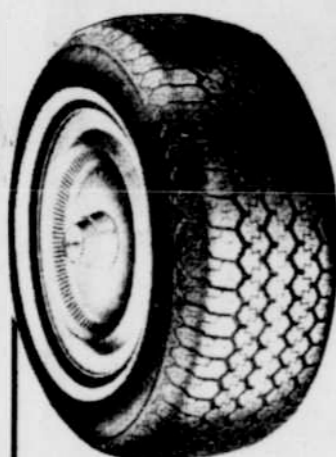

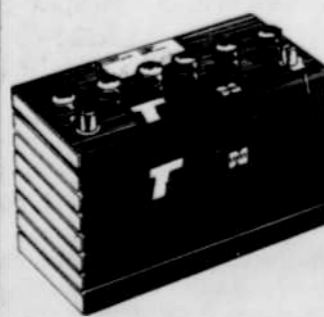

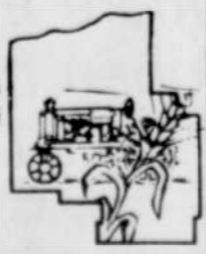
