Guide helps to assess finances in divorce

When divorce occurs, it's time for a careful assessment of a couple's financial assets and liabilities as well as making careful plans for the future that are in the best interests of all parties involved, points out Carol Bennett, Oregon State University Extension Agent in Morrow County.

An Oregon guide for "Making Financial Decisions When Divorce Occurs," EC1242, is now available from the Extension Service. The publication includes a series of worksheets designed to help the couple develop a clear picture of their financial situation as well as directions for computing child support under state guidelines adopted in October 1989.

Prepared by Alice Mills Morrow, Extension family economics specialist who is also an attorney and certified financial planner, the publication is not intended to substitute for legal or other qualified advisors, but to help clarify the couple's financial picture.
