ESD plans training

The Umatilla ESD is providing an educational interpreter training institute at BMCC this summer. The institute will provide valuable information to practicing educational interpreters as well as anyone in contact with a hearing impaired individual. Classes begin Friday, July 6 and continue through Friday, July 27.

Courses include interpreting theory (beginning, intermediate and advanced) manually coded English, American sign language also known as ASL (beginning and intermediate), language development and facilitation, combining signing exact English (S.E.E.) and ASL topics in special education and tutor-

ing and instructional practices. The summer training institute has been offered for several years and has recently received national endorsement and recognition from the Conference of Educational Administrators serving the Deaf, Inc.

Classes will be taught by staff of the ESD's Program for Hearing Impaired and three outside instructors representing the Washington State School for the Deaf, Portland Community College and Orange County Unified School District in California.
