BMCC offers Life Support classes

The Blue Mountain Community College Continuing Education Department is offering a course for people interested in becoming instructors for Basic Life Support classes. The course will be offered August 22, 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. in the Health Education Building, room 115.

The course will prepare the Basic Life Support provider to teach aspects of Basic Cardiac Life Support using current methods of adult education. The course follows approved American Heart Association and Oregon affiliated BLS task force guidelines.

Participants in the course are required to hold a current AHA Basic Life Support Card. There is a 90 day grace period allowed after expiration of the card. A copy of the current card must accompany registration and be brought to class.

Cost for the class is \$35, which includes lunch and instructor's manual; the fee must accompany registration. Class size is limited to 16. For more information and a registration form, call Kelly West at 1-800-526-5401 or 276-1260, ext. 290. Pre-registration is required by August 13.
