Through the Great Start program, the Morrow County Children and Youth Commission will be offering a free parenting education course in Heppner this fall for the parents of pre-school aged children. The course begins Monday, October 15, at 7:30 p.m., in the Heppner High School Library.

The course will follow the Early Childhood Systematic Training for Effective Parenting program EC/STEP. Lessons will include discussions of understanding and effectively disciplining young children, understanding young children's behavior, building self-esteem in the early years and com-

municating with them, helping young children to learn to cooperate, and nurturing emotional and social development. Participants in the course will receive a workbook as part of the course.

The course is being taught by Heppner High School counselor Liz Curtis. Curtis received her bachelor's degree in home economics and her master's degree in counseling. She is a trained teacher for the STEP and EC/STEP programs. 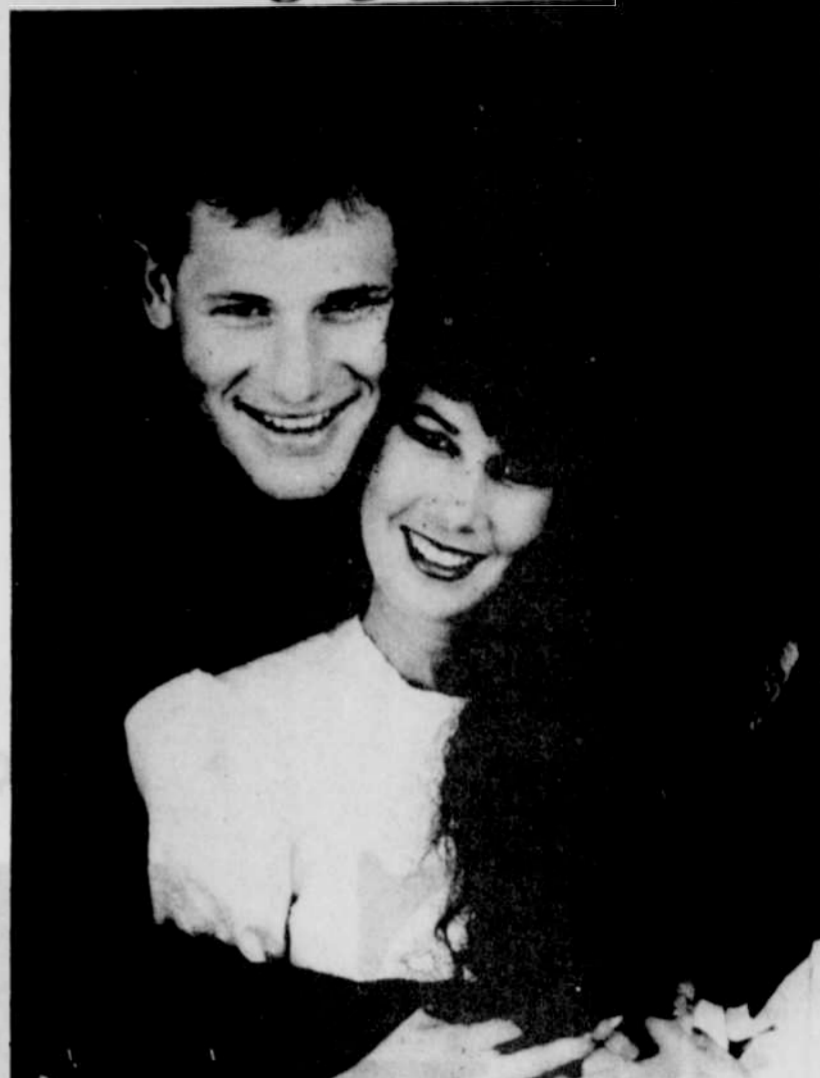
