The boundaries of the district are as follows: Beginning at the South meander line of the Columbia River and the West Section line of Section 15, Township 5 North, Range 26, E.W.M.; thence South along the West Section line of Sections 15, 22, 27 and 34, Township 5 North, Range 26, E.W.M.; and Sections 3, 10, 15 in Township 4 North, Range 26, E.W.M.; to the right-of-way of the main line of the Union Pacific Railroad Company; thence following the said right-of-way of the Union Pacific Railroad Company in a Southeasterly direction 9 miles, more or less, to the East boundary line of Morrow County, Oregon; thence following the boundary line of Morrow County, Oregon North to the South meander line of the Columbia River; thence West to the point of beginning; EXCEPTING all that area lying within the boundaries of the city limits of the City of Irigon, Oregon.

Violation of ORS 607.045, which prohibits livestock running at large within a livestock district, is an unclassified misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to \$2500.00 or imprisonment up to one year in the county jail, or both.
