



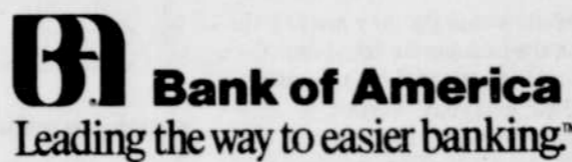

Septic system safety depends on maintenance

Nearly 24 percent of all American homes rely on septic systems to treat and dispose of household wastewater. Government regulations make sure that these systems meet certain standards so that when they are properly designed and installed, they are environmentally safe, according to water quality experts.

The most important factor in keeping a septic system operating properly is homeowner maintenance, so it's important to know the basic components of the system and how to keep them functioning properly.

Septic systems have two key elements—a septic tank and an absorption system. The septic tank is usually a concrete container, sized to suit your home needs, that receives wastewater from your bathroom, kitchen and laundry room. It allows heavy particles (sludge) to settle and light materials (scum) to float, so that bacteria in wastewater between them can liquefy the waste products.

The absorption system, or drainfield, consists of a distribution box, perforated distribution lines made of tile and a soil area that has the capacity to accept wastewater. This system receives wastewater from the septic tank and removes harmful, disease causing microorganisms, organics and nutrients.

A few common sense precautions should keep your septic system working well over a long period of time, according to Carol Bennett, Morrow County Extension agent.

It's important to know the locations of all the parts of your system and to keep heavy vehicles away from them. Also, avoid planting trees or shrubs near drain tiles—their roots can clog drain lines.

Be careful of what you dispose of in the toilet or in your drains. Household chemicals can destroy the bacteria in your septic tank. Garbage disposals can add unnecessary solids and grease to your system, and it is necessary to pump the tank much more frequently.

Conserve water whenever possible and try to distribute laundry and other chores that require water use throughout the week to avoid overloading your system on any particular day.

Monitor your septic tank annually and have a reputable contractor pump it out every three to five years.

Weather service seeks area weather spotters

Have you ever seen an unusual weather event and wondered if there was someone to whom you could have reported it? Do you find weather interesting and fascinating? Do you have some weather instruments?

If your answer to any of the above questions is yes, you could be a weather "spotter" for the National Weather Service. This government agency, which is part of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), is looking for such people.

A weather spotter is given a series of criteria which are used as guidelines in reporting severe weather such as tornadoes, funnel clouds, hail, strong winds, snow and freezing rain.

Information from spotters, coupled with radar, satellite and other data, has enabled the National Weather Service to issue more timely and accurate warnings for severe weather.

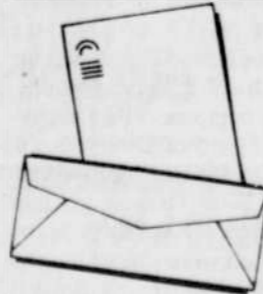
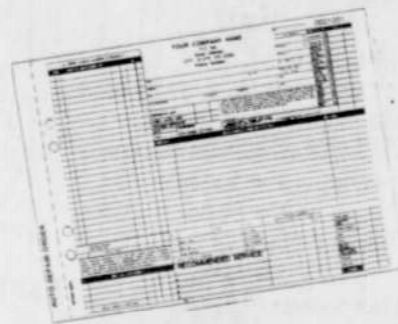
