Museum to host program by Oregon historian

Terence O'Donnell, noted author of "That Balance So Rare: The Story of Oregon", will speak at 7 p.m. Monday, April 29, at the Morrow County Museum. His program, called "The Face of a Place," will explore how the landscape of Oregon, like the face of a person, has been transformed by its history.

The program is sponsored by the Morrow County Museum and has been made possible by the Oregon Council for the Humanities, an affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities.

"The Face of a Place" surveys the landscape of Oregon and the changes the topography of the state has

undergone as a result of acts of humanity and of nature. A former research associate with the Oregon Historical Society, Terence O'Donnell has delighted audiences throughout the Northwest with his engaging and insightful presentations on our state's past. In addition to his extensive published writings, O'Donnell is a member of the Portland Historic Landmarks Commission and participated on the design team which won the international competition for Portland's Pioneer Courthouse Square. The program is free and open to the public.
