Aquatic fitness classes planned

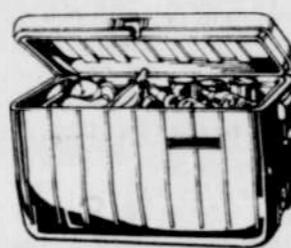
Aquatic fitness classes in both Ione and Heppner have been scheduled to begin July 9.
