The National Wool Act of 1954, provides that a referendum may be conducted to determine whether wool producers approve of a new agreement between the administrator, AMS and the American Sheep Industry Association, Inc. for the advertising and sales promotion of lamb and wool.

If producers indicate approval,

deductions will be made from shorn wool and unshorn lamb payments for 1991 through 1995 to finance ASI's activities.

The referendum will be held Aug. 19 through Aug. 30. Ballots will be mailed and may be returned to the Morrow County ASCS Office either in person or by mail. They must be postmarked by Aug. 30, 1991.
