HHS registration set for Aug. 19

Heppner High School has set registration day for Monday, August 19. Incoming freshmen and sophomores are asked to register from 8:30 to 11 a.m. and juniors and seniors will register from 1:00 to 3 p.m.

Fees for the 1991-92 school year will be as follows: Student body fee-\$6 (all students); yearbook-\$17 (optional); towel fee-\$2 (all PE students and athletes); padlock purchase-\$3 (optional).

There are no book fees charged at HHS, but students are required to pay replacement cost at the end of the year for any book that is damaged or lost.

The school also provides information on an insurance plan. The cost varies according to the type of insurance selected. A few insurance options are School-time Only Plan \$39 (preferred), \$17 (Economy Option), \$9 (Budget Option). Football-Only Plan \$168 (Preferred), \$79 (Economy), \$53 (Budget). Parents can opt to purchase one of these plans, place the student on their own plan, or leave the student uninsured. However, all athletes must be covered by some form of insurance.

Lockers will be assigned and students may review their schedule also. Please register at the requested date and time if possible.
