Sue Norton has been hired as a Heppner Day Care pre-school teacher. She will join Teresa Baker who is returning to teach again this year.

Four openings are left in the four-year-old class which begins Sept. 3 at 8:30 a.m.

Only six children have signed up for the three-year-old class. A minimum of 10 children is required in order to hold class. "If we do not get a minimum of 10 children we will not have three-year-old pre-school this year," said director Kathy Tellechea. "Please register your three-year-old as soon as possible if you plan on them attending pre-school so we will know if there will be enough children to have a

three-year-old class." Registration fee of \$7.50 for four-year-olds and \$5 for three-year-olds must be paid before school starts so supplies may be purchased. Tuition is \$50 a month for four-year-olds and \$25 a month for three-year-olds. Scholarships are available to children whose parents are financially unable to send them to pre-school.

## Cause of city pool problems discovered

City officials believe that they have discovered the cause of the problems with the Heppner Swimming pool. The pool has been closed intermittently throughout the swimming season because of cloudy water.

According to city administrator Gary Marks at the city council meeting August 12, an engineer's report indicates that the cloudiness is caused by a combination of sediment build-up in the pool's pipes which restricts the water flow and leaves sediment in the pool, and an ineffective filter system. A new filter system was installed July 12 but, while it has improved the filtering system, is not large enough to resolve the problem.

Other problems include cracks in the pool deck, and the existence of only one drain in the pool. According to city public works director Dave Winters, regulations now require more than one drain. Winters also said that regulations call for a six-hour turnover of water in the filtering system, which is not being met.

Marks said that the city will explore "new options" with regard to the city pool and plans to form a community group to explore the options. Anyone interested is invited to contact city hall.

Pool hours this week, contingent on the cloudiness of the water, are: Thursday 2:30-5:30 p.m. open swim, 5:30-6:30 lap swim and 7 to 8:30 p.m. open swim; Friday 2:30-5:30 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday 1 to 5 p.m. The pool will close Monday for the year.
