

Oregon Trail celebration in planning stages

Fourteen people from Morrow County recently attended a meeting in Pendleton concerning the Oregon Trail celebration in 1993. Workshops on the Oregon Trail have been held in various locations throughout the state. A state committee Julie Curtis, Carla Watson and Jill Thorne outlined the plans for the coming year.

The trail, 2,170 miles long, started in Independence, Missouri and ended officially in Oregon City, Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska, Wyoming, Idaho and Oregon are working together to

market the sesquicentennial (150th) year.

A variety of things are planned for the celebration, which the committee hopes will bring a great deal of tourism to the states involved. Those involved hope there will be many bus trips from the East to this area, as well as family outings.

To kick off the celebration Oregon officials are considering having a nighttime promotional photograph of the trail taken from an orbiting satellite, with the road traced by people standing along the rutted length holding lights.

Documentaries will be available for the use of the public. Plans are that all towns in the counties bordered by the trail will have some sort of celebration to attract the tourists to their area. Brochures will be sent to counties, businesses and others for the help in planning celebrations. County fairs will be asked to use some of this information in the fairs this coming year. Grants will be available to the counties to help with the plans.

The theme for this celebration is "Take the Trail Home". More publications and ideas for the public will be available as time goes on. Morrow County chairman is Marsha Sweek.

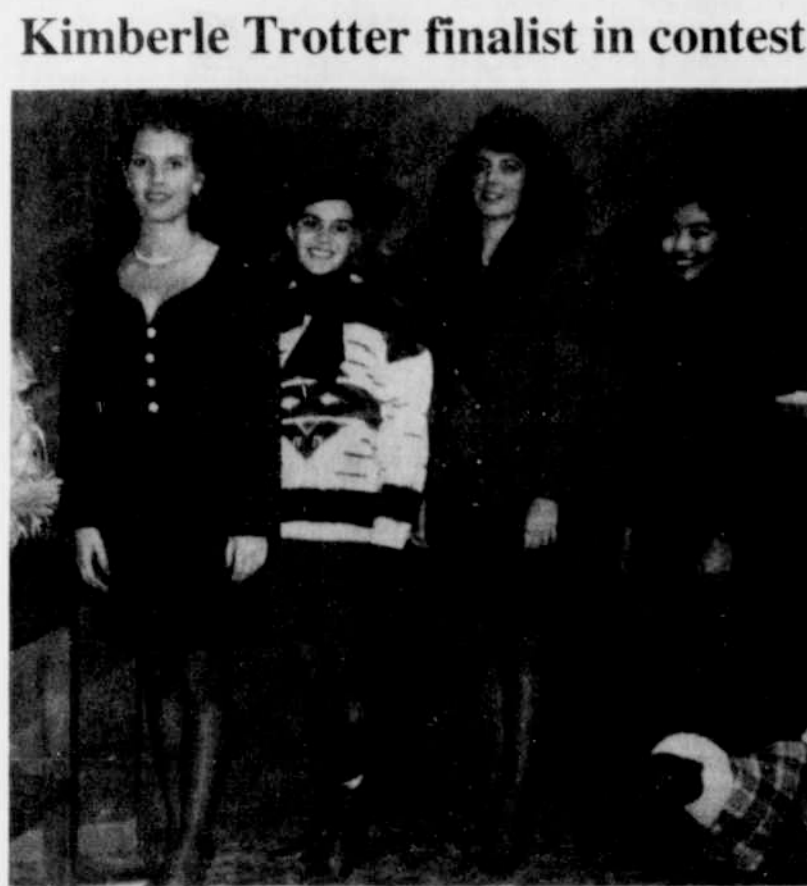
