Colleges list honor students

Oregon State University

Mark Fishburn of Heppner, has made the scholastic honor roll fall term at Oregon State University. Fishburn, a senior in engineering, earned a 3.5 or better grade point average.

A total of 259 students earned straight A (4.). Another 1,351 earned a B-plus (3.5) or better to make the listing. To be on the honor roll students must carry at least 12 graded hours of course work.

Western Oregon State College

A total of 227 students have been named to the president's list and another 513 students have been named to the honor roll for fall term at Western Oregon State College. President's list students achieved a perfect 4. grade point average, while honor roll students earned a 3.5 to 3.9. Sean Warren of Ione was named to the honor roll.

WOSC, a four-year liberal arts college has an enrollment of 3,863 students.

Blue Mountain Community College

Thirty-nine Blue Mountain Community College students received a perfect 4. grade point average during fall term. This reflects a straight A report in all courses taken by the student.

Students qualify for the president's list by attaining a GPA of 3.85 or higher. Ninety-three students qualified for the dean's list by receiving a GPA of 3.4 to 3.84. Ninety-eight students qualified for the fall term honor roll by receiving a GPA of 3. to 3.39.

To earn a position on any of the three lists, a student must have carried a full-time load of classes, which translates to 12 graded credit hours. Students may not have received an F in any class to be so honored. A pass grade does not count toward the 12

graded hours necessary to be included on the lists.

The County of Morrow will hold a public hearing on the 14th day of January 1992 at 7:00 o'clock p.m., at HEPPNER LIBRARY MAIN STREET, HEPPNER, OR 97836, to hear and consider any objections to or arguments in favor there may be upon the matter of the formation of a Library District encompassing the Boardman and Heppner areas. All interested persons may appear and be heard.
The Morrow County Court has entered an order declaring its approval of formation of said district.
The purpose for which the district is to be formed is to facilitate general library services to the public, including, but not limited to, providing the following:
(1) non-fiction, fiction, and large print books on loan;
(2) periodicals on loan;
(3) cassette and laser disc video material;
(4) reference material;
(5) on-line computer reference and interlibrary loan material;
(6) on-line access to state library computer data bases;
(7) children's library material and story hours;
(8) meeting locale;
(9) literacy and information access services;
The name of the proposed district is "The Oregon Trail Library District". The boundaries of the proposed Library District coincide with the boundaries of Morrow County Voting Precincts Number 1 and Number

2 (Boardman), together with the area encompassed by the Northwest Heppner Precinct, the Northeast Heppner Precinct, the Southwest Heppner Precinct and the Southeast Heppner Precinct, more particularly described as follows:

Morrow County Voting Precincts Number 1 and Number 2: Beginning at the junction of the Columbia River and the line between Range 25 EWM and Range 26 EWM; thence South along said line to the North line of I-84; thence West along the North line of I-84 to the Morrow County line; thence North to the Columbia River; thence East along the South boundary of the Columbia River to the point of beginning. ALSO: Beginning at the intersection point of the South line of I-84 and the West line of South Main, Boardman; thence South to the SE corner of the SW 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 21, Range 25 EWM, Township 4 North; thence West to the line between Sections 20 and 21; thence South to the line between Township 2 North and Township 3 North; thence West to the Morrow County line; thence North along the Morrow County line to the South boundary of I-84; thence East along the South line of I-84 to the point of beginning; and also beginning at the intersection point of the South line of I-84 and the West line of South Main, Boardman; thence South to the SE corner of the SW 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 21, Range 25 EWM, Township 4 North; thence West to the line between Sections 20 and 21; thence South to the line between Township 2 North and Township 3 North; thence East to the line between Range 25 EWM and Range 26 EWM; thence North to the South line of I-84; thence West along the South line of I-84 to the point of beginning.

Northwest Heppner Precinct:

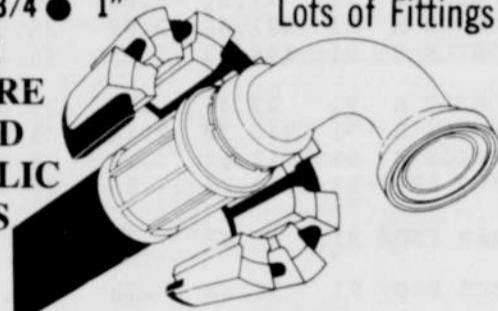
