

## Flu hurts lady Cards in match-up Cards dominate Culver

Leading scorer Kari Morgan, didn't dress down and most of the other girls on the team still showed signs of the bug. But the Lady Cards gamely came out swinging, and quickly jumped to a 15-5 first quarter lead. Unfortunately, it was then that the sickly Lady Cards ran out of steam and the Blue Devils got rolling. Mustering just nine points for the remainder of the game, Ione fell to its rival 24-47.

Nancy Morter led the Cards with 12 points. Janie Cupps had seven and April Taylor five to round out the scoring. Condon grabbed a 33-26 rebounding edge. Many were offensive boards put back up for baskets by the Blue Devils.

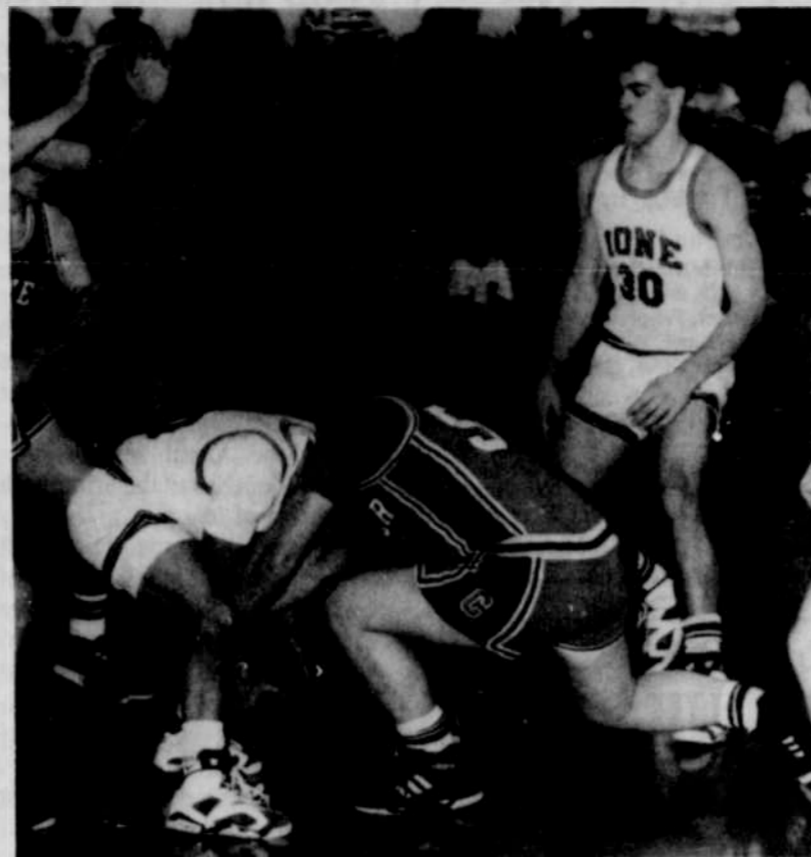
The Lady Cards had a dismal night shooting, hitting just 10 of 45 for 22 percent from the field. Condon hit 18 of 54 for 33 percent. The Cards managed just one of four from the line for 25 percent while Condon hit 10 of 18 for 56 percent.

"I was proud of the kids," said coach Heideman. "They went in and played hard." Heideman also praised the defense. "Defensively, we did a good job, especially in the first quarter," he said.

The Cards had a hot shooting night, making 39 of 78 from the floor for 50 percent. At the line, they hit eight of 12 for 67 percent.

"Again, we came out and played hard," said coach LaRue. "Everyone did a great job and the kids off the bench played well," he noted.

This weekend the Cards travel to Echo on Friday, Jan. 31 and play host to Condon on Saturday, Feb. 1.

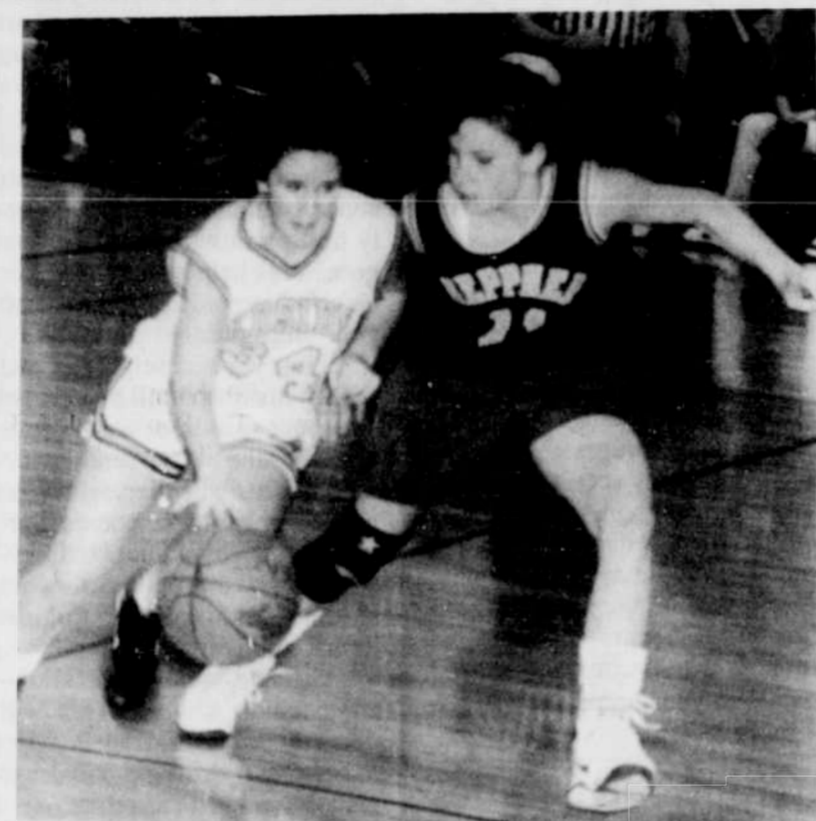

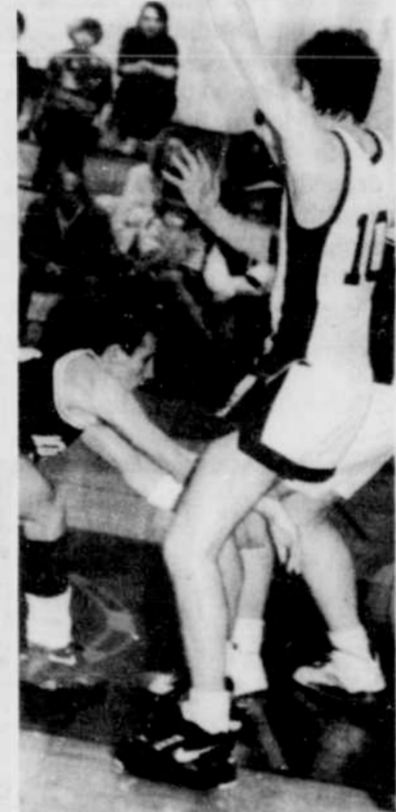
