Late scores by Dufur made the Friday game look closer than it actually was. With a 14-7 lead at halftime the Lady Cardinals broke the game open in the third quarter, opening a 15-point lead. Dufur sank some baskets in the closing seconds to bring the final score within eight, 35-27.

Janie Cupps was the game's high scorer with 12 points, followed by Nancy Morter with 11. Kari Morgan's nine rebounds led the Cards to a 27-25 rebounding edge. Cupps also had seven steals and Morter had two assists in the game.

Both teams shot 31 percent from the field, with Ione making 15 of 48 and Dufur hitting 11 of 35. The Lady Cards had a dismal performance at the line where they connected on just four of 13 for 31 percent.

On Saturday, Feb. 22, Sherman County threw an unexpected man-to-man defense at the Lady Cards, shaking them up enough to grab an 11-2 lead. With that kind of hole to dig out of plus several starters in early foul trouble, the Cards found themselves down at halftime 32-17. The second half wasn't much better as the Lady Cards couldn't buy a bucket and continued to be plagued by fouls. Late in the third quarter, four of the starters were benched with foul trouble. In the fourth quarter, the Cards tried

fouling one of the Huskies least successful free throw shooters to try to regain possession of the ball but as luck would have it, she picked this game to nail nine of her 10 attempts.

"We never got a break," said coach Dana Heideman, summing up the game. "Kids that had been shooting well didn't—we couldn't make anything from the outside," he added.

Nancy Morter led the Cardinals in scoring with 11 while Kari Morgan paced the team with nine rebounds and seven steals. Brandi Ball had two assists in the game.

Ione receives rescue vehicle

Arlington Volunteer Ambulance EMT III Doug Foster presented a rescue vehicle to Morrow County Medical Board chairman Jackie Bergstrom and Ione EMT II Jim Boor last Tuesday night in Ione.

The 1971 Suburban was donated to the Arlington Volunteer Ambulance crew by the South Gilliam County Health District. The Suburban has been used for the past two years as a backup vehicle by the Arlington crew. "We felt that we should donate it to someone who needed it," said Foster.

Boor said that the Suburban will be used as Ione's main rescue vehicle. Their previous rescue vehicle, which was donated to them by Kinzua Corp, will be retired.

Boor said that the new vehicle will serve the needs of the Ione community better because it will provide access to more areas. "If we have a farm accident," added Boor, "this vehicle can get right out into the field, where the old one was restricted to the highway." The vehicle will serve an area of around 300 square miles.

The shooting statistics told the story as Ione hit just 13 of 46 from the field for 28 percent and 10 of 24 for 42 percent from the line. Sherman was 19 of 39 from the floor for 49 percent and 17 of

22 for 77 percent from the line. "We struggled offensively in the last half of the season," said Heideman, but he noted that the Lady Cards did finish the season with a respectable 18-4 record.
