

## Fashion, fabric booklet available

If you don't know the difference between a tuxedo and pterrot collar or butcher cloth and charmeuse, then the Oregon State University Extension Service has two new publications that will help you understand fashion styles and fabric terms.

"Fashion Terms and Styles for Women's Garments and Fashion Terms: Apparel Fabric Glossary" were written to assist consumers, explains Ardis Koester, Extension textiles and clothing specialist.

"Fashion Terms and Styles," written by Koester and Nancy O. Bryant, OSU associate professor of apparel, interiors, housing and merchandising, includes both text and illustrations of basic terms and styles that consumers will see in catalogs and other advertisements.

Fashion catalog photographs and fashion sketches sometimes make it difficult to see the styles, the specialist observes. The publication illustrations are the

same type of line drawings used in pattern catalogs to show details.

By the way, a tuxedo collar is a variation of a shawl collar, continuing the length of the garment's front opening. Pterrot is a straight ruffled collar, usually with two rows of ruffles, that lays on top of the shoulders. Butcher cloth is a medium-weight, plain weave fabric made from irregular coarse yard. Charmeuse is a lightweight fabric, with hard twist warp yarns and crepe filling yarns in a satin weave.
