Lillie L. Sasser, 102, of Fossil died Friday, April 24, 1992 at Pioneer Memorial Nursing Home in Heppner.

The funeral was held at the First Baptist Church in Fossil on Tuesday, April 28. Concluding service and burial followed at the IOOF Cemetery in Fossil.

Mrs. Sasser was born March 24, 1890 at London, Ky., to William and Martha Asher Reams. The family moved to Mitchell in 1907 where she completed her education. She then began working at the hotel and at ranches in the area.

On March 24, 1910 she married Scott Sasser at Mitchell. In 1911 they moved to Fossil.




