North Lex Livestock

On April 11 the North Lex Livestock Club of Ione and Lexington traveled to Hermiston for a tour of the C & B Livestock operation. Thirty-one members and eight adults gathered at one of their barns where they inspected several heifers and bulls while the manager of C & B, Dan Banke, talked briefly about the breed of each one. The group then stopped momentarily to watch Dan artificially inseminate two heifers.

After this tour of the breeding operation, they crossed the highway to tour the feedlot. Dan said that roughly 30 percent of the steers are slaughtered and sold at Safeway. He also said that the steers eat potato and cannerly waste. About 60 percent of the steer's food is French fries. C & B Livestock utilizes food waste from Lamb Weston, a farm in Umatilla and some other food processing plants in the area.

The group finished the day with

a pizza at Pizza Hut.

The North Lex Livestock Club boasts one of its biggest memberships ever with 47 members in all. The large animal club is led by Jim Swanson and Donna Rietmann along with George Miller, in charge of hogs, Joe McElligott with steers and Stacy Weinright with lambs. Twenty-eight club members are raising hogs, 14 have steers and five have lambs. Leader Jim Swanson says he continues to be quite amazed at the interest and enthusiasm shown by members, many of whom are beginners.

The City of Heppner has received a Referendum Petition which will be circulated to obtain signatures for referral to the voters. The ballot title for this Referendum Petition is as follows:

CAPTION: Referral of City of Heppner Ordinance 493-92

QUESTION: Should the City of Heppner repeal ordinance 493-92, the Transient Room Tax Ordinance?

SUMMARY: On April 13, 1992, the Heppner Council adopted a Transient Room Tax Ordinance. The measure, if passed, repeals the ordinance. The ordinance places 5% charge on those who rent rooms on less than a monthly basis and on overnight R.V. users. The money raised goes to: (1) 10% to the business owner to cover costs of collection; (2) 10% to the City and; (3) 80% to the Heppner Chamber of Commerce. The chamber provides economic and community development activities for the City of Heppner.

Any City elector dissatisfied with the ballot title may file a petition in the Morrow County Circuit Court asking for a different title and stating the reasons that the ballot title is insufficient, not concise or unfair. The petition must be filed in court within seven business days after the publication of the date of this notice.


