The menu for the birthday dinner Aug. 26 will be salad bar, rolls, ice cream and cake. Members of the Catholic Church will serve.

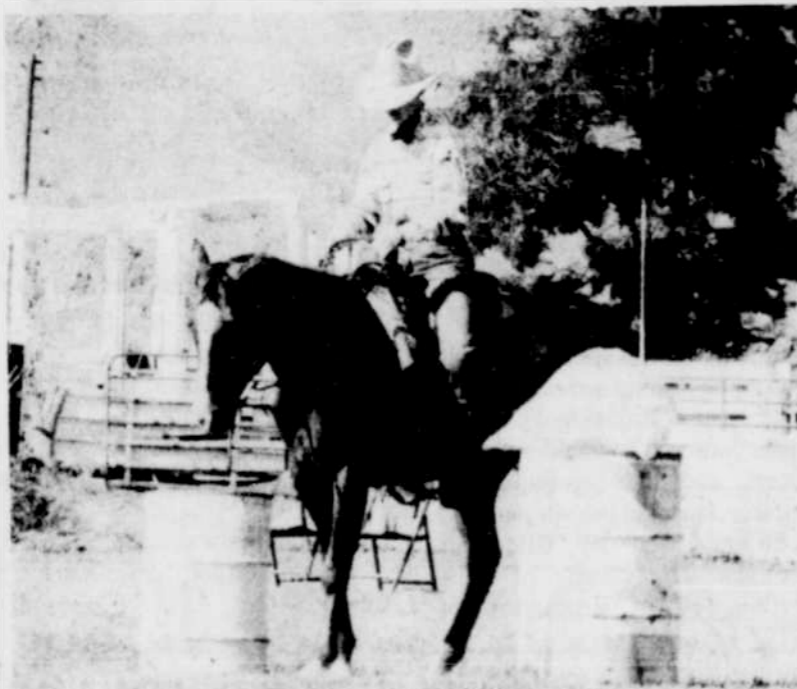

MARTIN/NOTCH FOREST PLANTATION FERTILIZATION

USDA-Forest Service Umatilla National Forest Heppner Ranger District Morrow and Wheeler Counties, Oregon

On August 17, 1992, Heppner District Ranger, Delanne Ferguson, made a decision to implement the Martin/Notch Forest Plantation Fertilization project on the Heppner Ranger District. These fertilization treatments would enhance growth on plantations for the purpose of creating cover for big game. The need for the fertilization comes as a result of loss of big game cover habitat due to defoliation and tree mortality from spruce budworm and bark beetles. Fertilization would take place within planted units in the following past sale areas; Martin, Notch Seed Tree, Elkhorn, and West End Seed Tree.

The associated Decision Memo and Analysis File are available upon request from the Umatilla National Forest, 2517 SW Hailey Avenue, Pendleton, OR 97801 and the Heppner Ranger District, P.O. Box 7, Heppner, Oregon OR 97836.

Appeals must be filed no later than 45 days after the legal notice of this decision was first published in the East Oregonian newspaper, Pendleton, OR.
