Pioneer Days planned in Boardman

Umatilla Indians, Mountain Men and a pioneer covered wagon pulled by oxen are highlights of the Pioneer Days Parade, 10 a.m. in Boardman on Saturday, August 29 in conjunction with pioneer days Aug. 29 and 30.

A special parade feature will be the "Kid's Dress Up Contest." Youth costumed as Native Americans, Mountain Men or pioneers will be judged at 9:30 a.m. prior to joining the parade. The Pioneer Parade will conclude with a giant 75th birthday cake served at the Marina.

Parade entries from the Columbia Basin are invited. Pre-registration is necessary for parade participants. Registration forms are available at the Boardman City Hall, North Main and Boardman Ave. or from Karen Purcell, parade coordinator. Registration forms should be returned to city hall by August 27.

Parade staging will begin at 9 a.m. at N.E. Main and Front Street behind the Chevron Station.

The concluding Boardman Diamond Jubilee Event will be a two-day pioneer celebration. Most events will center around the Marina Park. An Indian village, stick games, dances, bow demonstrations, storytelling, Interpretive Center, and fry bread are examples of events focusing on Native American lifestyles along the river edge.

A Mountain Man encampment, complete with black powder shoot, hatchet throw, trapper run, hawk and knife test, fry pan and rolling pin toss will represent the life of early European explorers and trappers.

Kessler's chicken barbecue, All American French Fries and Mexican food will add flavors of the current cultures combining in Boardman.

Marina activities will begin with a breakfast served by the Boardman Eagles from 6 to 9 a.m., Saturday and Sunday. The Marina demonstrations, crafts and entertainment will begin at noon on Saturday.

Senator Fawbush has a very revealing voting record. Of particular interest is his position on the gasoline card-lock system. It is difficult to believe that the majority of his constituents agree with him. But he did tell us at a public meeting in Baker City that he would vote the way he likes, often disregarding our desires, because he knows better that we do what is good for us.

Luckily, we have a capable, experienced private rights advocate waiting in the wings for the November showdown. Wes Cooley understands rural people and their needs. I believe Wes Cooley is the one we should, and will, elect to represent us in the State Senate, and give Wayne Fawbush a much deserved rest.
