

Lutheran churches begin fall Sunday school program

September is Christian Education month in the congregations of Hope and Valby Lutheran Churches. The youth of Valby and their teachers will begin the 1992-93 Saturday School program on September 12. The program will run from 10 to 11:30 a.m. The theme of this year's program of singing, Bible study and arts and crafts is "The Greatest Adventure: Jesus Saves the World". Valby will also hold a six hour prayer vigil from 10

a.m. until 4 p.m. on Sept. 12. Members will take turns praying for the work of the local church as well as the synod and national church. Sunday morning the adults of the congregation will gather at 8:15 a.m. for a study of the Sunday morning scripture lessons used in worship service.

The class topic will be St. Paul's letter to the Galatians.

Seventh and eighth graders and their parents will meet on Tuesday, Sept. 15, 7 p.m. to discuss the confirmation program.

Sunday morning worship services at Valby begin at 9 a.m. at the Valby Lutheran Church located on the Lone-Gooseberry Road. Sunday school and worship services at Hope Lutheran Church located near the dam, begin at 11 a.m.

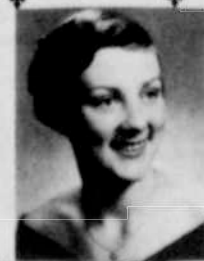
Lucas — Wilson
