## Cranberries an American tradition

"Cranberries are an American tradition," says Carol Michael-Bennett, OSU extension home economist in Morrow County. Long before the pilgrims, Indians were crushing these bright red berries with dried deer meat and melted fat to make pemmican.

Oregon's cranberry production ranks fourth in the nation behind Massachusetts, Wisconsin and New Jersey. These brightly colored berries thrive in the long, cool growing seasons of coastal Oregon.

Oregon's crop currently goes to processors who make products such as juice and sauce.

The fresh cranberries available in supermarkets during the holiday season come from out of state (especially Washington and Massachusetts). Look for plump, firm berries that are bright and shiny when you buy them.

For best quality, use refrigerated cranberries within a month. For longer storage, you can freeze them right in the bag or in the freezer container. When ready to use, wash and sort out soft berries and stems.

Cranberries are low in calories (50 calories per cup) and a source of vitamin C, says Carolyn Raab, OSU extension foods and nutrition specialist.

This versatile fruit can be used in pies, muffins, puddings and quick breads. For example, combine cranberries with chopped fresh or dried sweet fruits (apples, apricots) for pie fillings. Or chop lightly sweetened berries (1/4 cup sugar to one cup cranberries) to your favorite muffin recipe.
