Nonsedating Antihistamines: A New Warning

Recently the U.S. Food and Drug Administration asked the manufacturers of the "nonsedating antihistamines" to contact pharmacists, physicians, and other health professionals. The contact regards a new warning that should be observed when these medicines are used or are considered for use.

Nonsedating antihistamines are available by prescription and include terfenadine (*Seldane*) and astemizole (*Hismanal*). These medicines are popular because they do not cause drowsiness or sedation associated with other antihistamines. The new warning about these two drugs indicates that serious cardiovascular events, including death, have been observed. Heart-related problems seem to occur when:

- ketoconazole (an antifungal medicine) or the antibiotic erythromycin also are being taken,

- a patient has significant liver function problems, or

- a higher than the recommended dose is taken. According to a recent report in *American Pharmacy* single doses of terfenadine as low as 360 mg have caused heart-related problems.

Persons who currently take or are considering taking a nonsedating antihistamine should discuss the medicine with their physician and their pharmacist.
