The Ione Cardinals were clicking in the first half of their game against Heppner last Tuesday, Jan. 12, leading 22-17 at the end of one and 42-35 at halftime. But the teamwork that worked so well in the first half came undone in the second and the Mustangs rolled on to a 75-62 victory.

Ryan Halvorsen, Jason Halvorsen and Aaron Heideman each had nine points to lead the Cards but Heppner's Leonard Brittrner scored 26 to take the game scoring honors. The Cards ended the game with a 36-32 rebounding advantage, led by Aaron Heideman with 13. Both Aaron and Deacon Heideman had three blocked shots. David Wagenblast led the team with five steals and eight assists.

The Cards shot 17 of 50 for 34 percent from the floor and 25 of 35 from the line for 72 percent. Heppner was 27 of 59 for 46 percent from the floor and 18 of 35 for 51 percent from the line.

"We played really well in the first half. We went away from things we were successful in the first half and that killed us," noted coach Del LaRue.
