James E. Barrett, 63, died of cancer at his home in Heppner on January 17, 1993.

Mr. Barrett was born to Melvin and Gladys Kuder Barrett on April 21, 1929 in Portland. He grew up in Portland and attended Benson High School. In 1947 he joined the Navy and during his 20 years of service was stationed in Florida, Japan, Texas, California and the Philippines. He also served in the Korean Conflict and Vietnam, retiring in 1967.

Mr. Barrett worked for Northwest Roads as a mechanic in Portland and later moved to Heppner to work as a millwright for Kinzua Corp. He was employed in the logging industry for many years before he retired in 1990 because of his health.
