

## Co-gen plant to provide PGE power

The Coyote Springs Co-Generation Plant at Boardman will be part of the replacement power needed by Portland General Electric after closing the Trojan Nuclear Plant, according to Peggy Fowler, PGE's vice president for power generation. Fowler told the Boardman Chamber of Commerce last week that "Coyote Springs is a major step forward," in the effort to secure power for the future.

Coyote Springs was conceived following a Visions 2000 meeting sponsored by the Boardman Chamber three years ago at which Fowler predicted the future of co-generation, said a press release. The plant, to be located in the Port of Morrow's Food Processing Park has been developed to date by the port and a subsidiary

of PGE.

Named for a nearby natural spring of the same name, Coyote Springs will use natural gas to drive turbines to generate electricity, and then the exhaust gases will create process steam for additional generation or for use in the food processing industries nearby. Either one or two 220 megawatt generators will be installed by 150 construction workers and then operated by about 30 permanent employees.

Kent Goodyear, president of the Port of Morrow, said the plant would make present food processing industries more competitive because the cost of steam would be significantly less than the cost they now incur generating their own. He added that additional inexpensive steam would be available to attract more

industries to the area, especially those that use a lot of steam.

Fowler said that PGE might expand the Boardman Coal Fired plant near Boardman, but with natural gas fired turbines rather than another coal fired unit. "Coal would be too expensive and not environmentally feasible," she said.

A site certificate application was filed in January, according to Fowler. She said she expects the Oregon Energy Facility Siting Council to approve the certificate in about a year. Construction would take about two years and the plant could be on line by the end of 1996.
