Ione boys win four-way meet

The lone boys grabbed 11 first places and tallied 129 points to win a four way meet held at Umatilla last Tuesday, April 13.

Deacon Heideman was a triple winner, taking the discus 140'6" the shot 38'11" and the 110 hurdles 16.72. Mac Lovett took the 100 in 12.32 and the 200 in 24.77 and Ryan Halvorsen won the high jump at 5'6" and the javelin in 136'8". Justin Miller set a new school record in the pole vault, taking first place in 12'7" and Jim Logan won the 400 meter in 53.86. Both the 400 and 1600 relay teams took first in 46.84 and 3:43.05 respectively.

Other finishers for the boys were: David Wagenblast second in the discus and the 300 hurdles. Brian Holtz put the shot 34'11" for fourth while Deacon Heideman came in fifth with 34'1". Holtz also placed fourth in the 100 12.7 and third in the javelin, 112'7". Heideman placed fourth in the high jump 5'2", javelin 110'1" and the triple jump 33'11".

Jake Bacon was a fifth place finisher in the high jump jumping 5'2", fifth in the 400 57.96 and fourth in the 800 2:27.5. Ryan Halvorsen finished second in the long jump 18'5 3/4" and triple jump 38'100.

Jason Proudfoot finished fourth in the long jump 17'9 1/2" and third in the 400 56.8.

Greg Holtz finished third in the javelin 112'7" and 100 12.66 and finished fifth in the 200 25.9.

Bjerke finished fifth in the javelin 107'10" and triple jump 31'5 1/2", third in the 110 hurdles 19. and 300 hurdles 49.14, while Rodney Ehrmantraut finished fifth in the 100 hurdles 20.49.

In the 800 Nathan Heideman placed third 2:24.91 and Crum placed fifth, 2:36.04. Crum also finished third in the 300, 11:18.84 while Cotterell finished fifth 11:51.02.

In girls action, Jamie Lovett's first in the shot and discus led the Cardinals to a win with 77 points. She took the shot with a throw of 27'6" and the discus in 87'6". April Taylor won the javelin with a throw of 78'6". Crystal Minster took the 400 in 69.27 and Kim Bedortha won the 3000 meters in 13.38.76. Other results are:

Becky Picknell second in shot 27'5" and javelin 76'4" and third in discus 66'5";

Tanja Anderson fourth in shot 23'7 1/2", second in Discus 84'2".

Kim Bedortha took fifth in shot 20'2", discus 60'11" and javelin 61'10 1/2".

Melissa McElligott was a second place finisher in the long jump with a 13'9 1/2" jump and second in the triple jump and 100, 13.91.

April Taylor ran the 1500 in 5:58.37 and the 800 in 2:58.07 for second place finishes.

Jamie Lovett finished fourth in the triple jump and javelin 62'5" in both.

Crystal Minster finished third in the 200 with 31.3.

Workshop set on Oregon Trail clothing

Ricia Saxton Burgan, founder of the Society for the Preservation of Fashion and Textiles, a Boise Idaho educational organization, will conduct a workshop on Oregon Trail Clothing in Heppner, on Saturday, May 1. The purpose of the workshop is to enable residents to put together authentic costumes for Oregon Trail Celebrations.

The workshop will be conducted at the Heppner Elementary School, from 11 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Participants will learn the cultural and social perspectives that influenced costume in 1843, receive tips for selecting appropriate patterns and fabrics for the era. Participants will learn to

create visually appropriate costumes for men, women and children participating in Trail Celebration events. Students will receive a 37 page workbook with their registration fee. Additional enrichment materials and patterns will be available for purchase if desired.

Cost of the workshop will be \$10 for registrations received by April 28. Registration received after April 28, or at the door will be \$12. The workshop is co-sponsored by the Oregon State University Extension Service and the Morrow County Museum. For more information call the Morrow County Extension Service, 676-9642.

Cards place in track tourney

At last weekend's Condon Invitational Saturday, April 17, the lone track teams slogged through pouring rain to grab fourth place on the girls side with 37 points and fifth for the boys with 38.

Kim Bedortha grabbed second in the 3000 meters with a time of 13:57.75. Also placing second was the 1600 relay team of Crystal Minster, Melissa McElligott, Becky Wagenblast and April Taylor in 4:45.61. McElligott was third in the long jump with a leap of 14'11" and tied for third in the 100 in 13.88. Jamie Lovett was fourth in the discus with a throw of 87'1". Tanja Anderson placed fifth in the discus with a throw of 83'5". April Taylor was fifth in the 1500 in 5:54 and Crystal Minster was fifth in the 400 in 67.27.

For the boys, Jim Logan set an area best in winning the 400 meters in 53.28. The 1600 relay team of Jim Logan, David Wagenblast, Justin Miller and Jason Proudfoot placed second in 3:44.31. Proudfoot was third in the 1500 in 4:48.49. Miller was fourth in the pole vault at 11'6". Four boys had cleared 11'6"

before the event was called due to windy conditions. Places were awarded on fewer misses. Ryan Halvorsen placed fourth in the long jump with a leap of 17'11 3/4" and fifth in the triple jump at 37' 6 1/4". Rodney Ehrmantraut was fifth in the pole vault at 9'0" and Tony Bjerke rounded out the scoring with a fifth in the 300 hurdles in 47.75.
