It should be pointed out that communities such as Lebanon, Elgin, Myrtle Creek, Umatilla and Hermiston have had their Main Streets and sidewalks redone outside of the six-year plan and we would like to be included. In the meantime, the tree fund is set aside with the donor names and who knows, some dark night a vigilante committee may just have a tree planning project. Some of us are tired of waiting. Seriously, your patience is most appreciated and a tree-lined street will come to be.
