

Spring brings noxious weeds

April showers have brought on a good crop of noxious weeds this year," says a press release from the Morrow County Weed Control District. Scotch thistle, yellow starthistle, poison hemlock and everyone's favorite, diffuse knapweed, are popping up all over. "The time to take care of these exotic weeds is now, if the preferred method is spraying," said the release. Young, actively growing plants are easier to control and require less herbicide to achieve desired results.

Since landowners are required to control noxious weeds by law it is important to be able to recognize seedlings and small infestations before the cost of con-

trol skyrockets, continued the release.

The Morrow County Weed Control District can help landowners identify noxious weed problems and provides cost-share assistance for "A" List noxious weeds.

While the district prefers to work "with" the landowner on specific weed problems, the county ordinance allows the weed district to impose fines of up to \$500 for noncompliance and charge the cost of controlling noxious weeds to the tax lot as a first lien.
