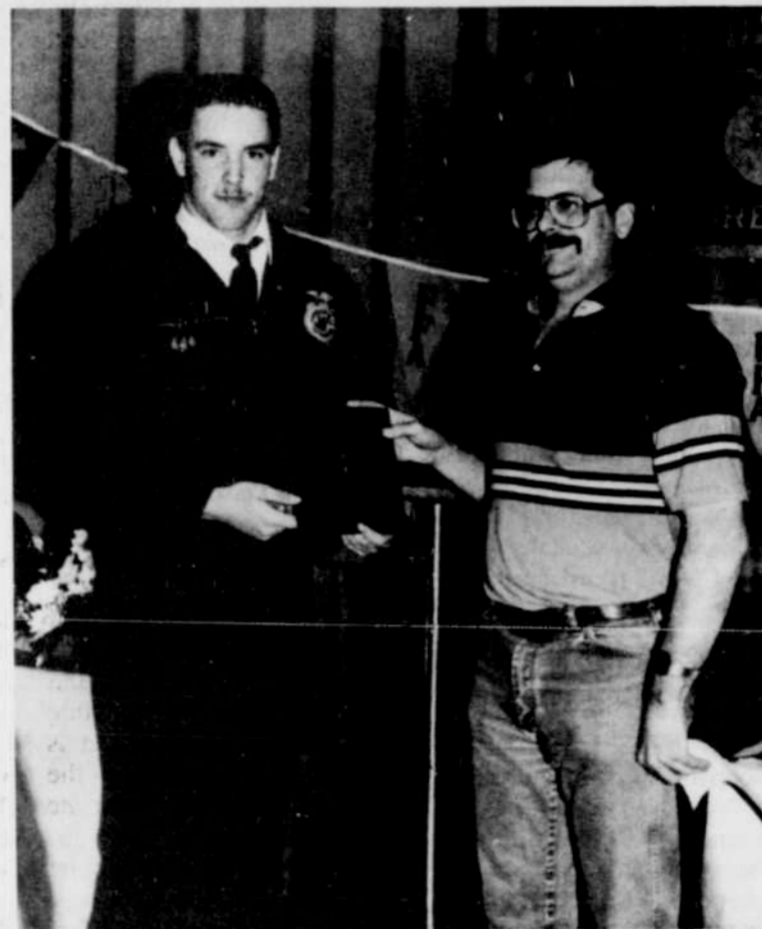
The highlight of the year for the chapter is the recognition of the outstanding new member and recognition of the most outstanding FFA member. These awards

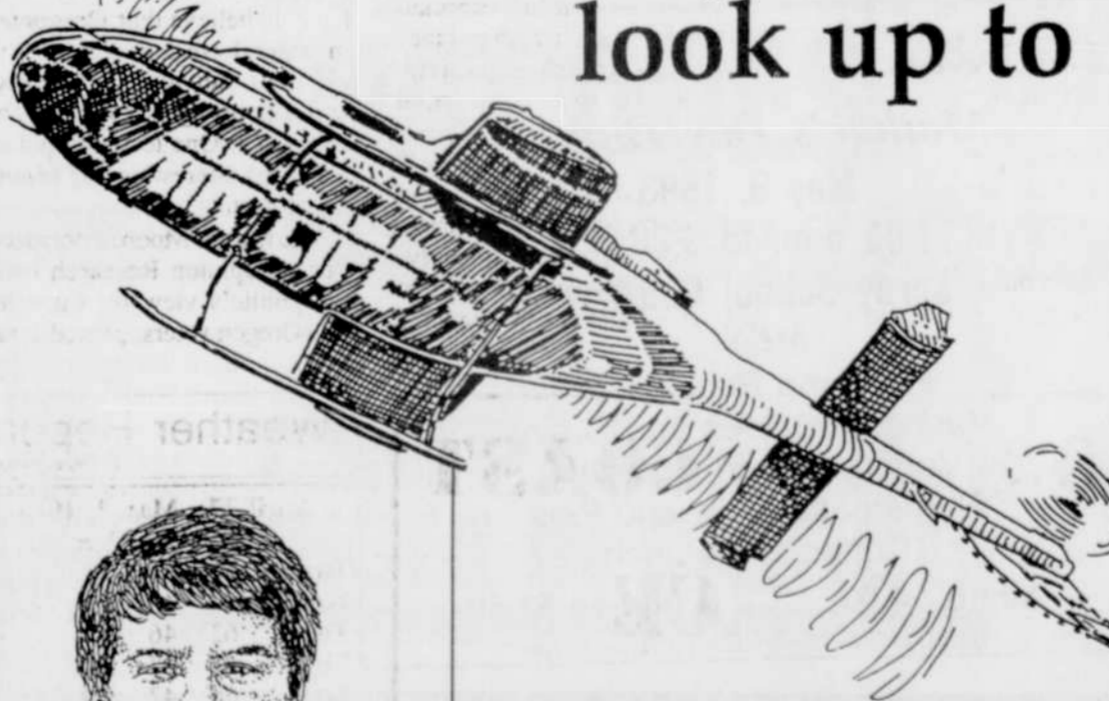

Steve Wilson of Bend, took a 40 foot fall (out of a possible 400) when he lost his footing while putting out a brush fire below the bridge at Crooked River Gorge in Central Oregon.

The impact snapped three ribs, punctured a lung, and broke his back.

The meticulous three-hour rescue by Jefferson County rescue teams, Oregon State Police, Steve's co-workers and Air Life of Oregon brought Steve safely to solid ground and transport by Air Life to St. Charles Medical Center in Bend.

"I'd recommend people join up with Air Life," he said. "I never thought I would need them, but circumstances proved otherwise."
