

Ione girls run away with district track championship

The Ione girls piled up 158 points to run away with the championship at last weekend's district track meet, but the boys couldn't overcome Dufur's sprint strength, placing second with 155 1/2 to the Rangers' 180 1/2. The top two finishers in each event advanced to the State 1A meet to be held Saturday, May 22 at Western Oregon State College in Monmouth.

Melissa McElligott was a triple winner as well as handling a leg on the school-record breaking 1600-relay team. She won the triple jump with a leap of 31'10 1/2" the long jump in 15' 1/4" and the 100 meter in 13.26 sec. She teamed with Crystal Minster, April Taylor and Becky Wagenblast to lower the school long relay record to 4:34.65.

Jamie Lovett set a school record in the discus, winning it with a throw of 109'4". She was also fourth in the shot with a throw of 30'4 1/2" and fifth in the 200 in 33.31.

Taylor won the 1500 in 5:43.39, placed third in the javelin in 93'7" and was fourth in the 800 in 2:53.56.

Kim Bedortha won the 3000 in 14:23.59, placed second in the

1500 in 6:24.96 and was sixth in the triple jump in 25'9 3/4".

Wagenblast was second in the high jump in 4'4", and third in the 800 in 2:44.18 and the 300 IH in 58.49.

Tanja Anderson was third in the discus in 92'4", and the 100 hurdles in 22.3, and fourth in the 300 hurdles in 66.46.

Crystal Minster placed third in the 400 in 65.48, fourth in the triple jump at 29' 1/2", and fifth in the long jump at 13'2 1/2".

Marie Tworek brought home third in the 3000 meters and Becky Picknell rounded out the score with a fifth in the shot and sixth in the discus.

Deacon Heideman won three events for the boys, but it wasn't enough to get by the Dufur Rangers who swept the top three places in the 100, 200 and 400.

Heideman set a new school record in the discus with a throw of 155'10". He also won the shot in 43'6 1/2" and the 110 high hurdles in 15.79.

Justin Miller won the pole vault in 12'6 and Ryan Halvorsen won the triple jump in 39'10. Halvorsen also took third in the long jump in 19'3 1/2 and fourth in the 300 hurdles in 45.23.

The 400 relay was second in 46.57 and the 1900 relay also finished second in 3:41.19.

Jason Proudfoot took second in the 1500 meters in 4:42.91. He was also fourth in the 800 in 2:17.95 and second in the pole vault in 9'6.

Jake Bacon improved his time in the 800 to 2:11.28, placing second.

Rodney Ehrmantraut took third in the pole vault at 9'0 and sixth

in the 110 hurdles.

David Wagneblast placed third in the discus at 117'8 and fourth in the 400 in 53.92.

Rob Crum brought home a third in the 300 meters and Jason Halvorsen placed fourth in the high jump at 5'8 and sixth in the javelin.

Tony Bjerke placed fourth in the 110 hurdles in 17.78 and sixth in the 300 hurdles.

Ione track teams place third

The Ione track teams prepped for the upcoming district meet with a CBC/Big Sky meet last weekend. The boys scored 79 points to finish third behind Dufur with 112 and Wahtonka with 80. The girls also finished third, scoring 66 points. Pilot Rock won the girls side of the meet with 140 points; Sherman had 75.

Deacon Heideman continued to dominate the discus, winning with a throw of 147' 6 1/4". He was also second in the 110 hurdles in 16.32 and second in the shot with a throw of 43'3 1/2".

Ryan Halvorsen won the triple jump with a leap of 39'8 3/4". He was also fourth in the 300 hurdles in 45.27. Both the 400 and 1600 relay teams placed second in 46.37 and 3:44.04 respectively.

Jim Logan returned to action, finishing third in the 400 in 54.96. Rob Crum was fourth in the 3000 in 11:26.44. Heath Cotterell was fifth in the same event in 11:34.04.

Other fifth place finishers were: Jason Halvorsen in the high

Mac Lovett placed fourth in the 200 in 24.63 and fifth in the 100 in 12.01.

Brian Holtz finished fifth in the shot at 40'2 and sixth in the javelin while Aaron Heideman finished fifth in the high jump at 5'8" and Andrew Anderson fifth in the 1500 in 5:35.71.

Corry Baker finished fifth in the 800; and Heath Cotterell fifth in the 3000.

April Taylor was third in the 1500 with a time of 5:40.88. Taylor also placed fourth in the javelin with a throw of 80'2".

Crystal Minster placed third in the 400 with a time of 1:05.77. Becky Picknell was third in the shot at 29' 4 1/2". She also placed sixth in the discus at 80' 1/2".

Becky Wagenblast was fourth in two events, the high jump at 4'0" and the 800 in 2:47.05. The 1600 relay team also placed fourth with a time of 4:41.91.

Tanja Anderson placed fifth in the discus with a throw of 80'8" and Jamie Lovett finished fifth in the shot at 28'10".

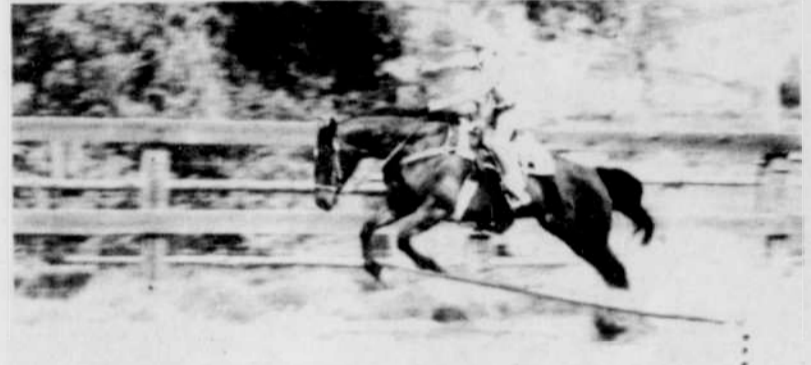
the shutout as the game was called after five innings on the 10 run rule. Wicklund has been a key ingredient for the Mustang success as he has held the pitching staff together.
