The ballot title caption is: "ONE YEAR OPERATING LEVY OUTSIDE THE TAX BASE"

Shall Morrow County levy \$3,240,535 outside the tax base for operating purposes for fiscal year 1993-94?

This levy is \$37,015 less than the levy presented in May. The reduction was made by not allowing cost of living increases for all Department Heads, and reduc-

tions in the County Court travel budget. The purpose of this levy is to provide funds to balance the Morrow County operating budget for fiscal year 1993-94, which includes: Road Fund, County School Fund, Other Road Districts Fund (distributed to the cities), Fair & Rodeo Fund, and General Fund (includes funding for Extension Service, Weed Control District, Soil & Water Conservation District, Boardman/Irrigon Emergency Assistance, Morrow County Neighborhood Council, Morrow County Museum, Justice Court, Juvenile Director, as well as those services required by Oregon Law). The tax is subject to the other governmental purposes limit of section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

An Elector may file petition for review of this ballot title in the Morrow County Circuit Court no later than 5:00 p.m. on June 7, 1993.
