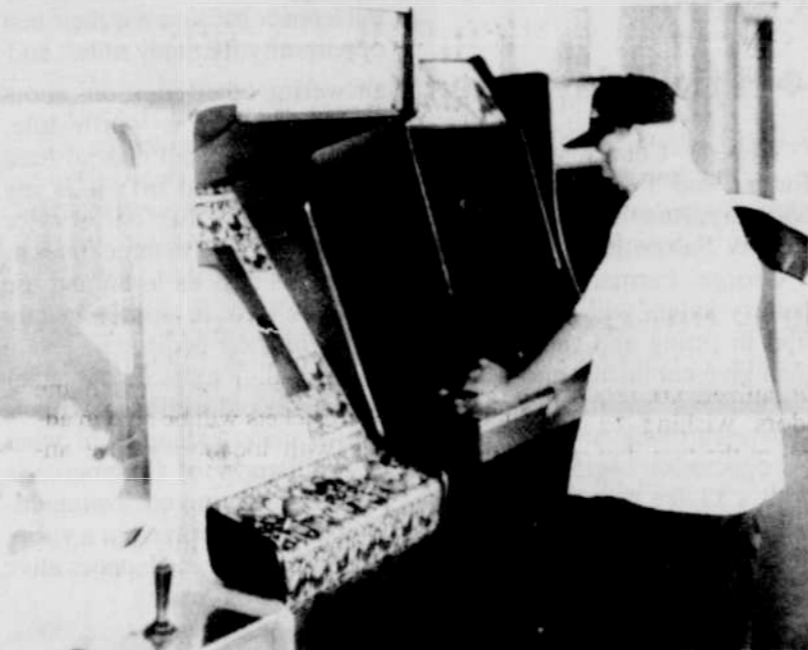
--Eldon and Barbara Gilbert returned home on Tuesday from a Caribbean cruise and a trip to the southern states.
