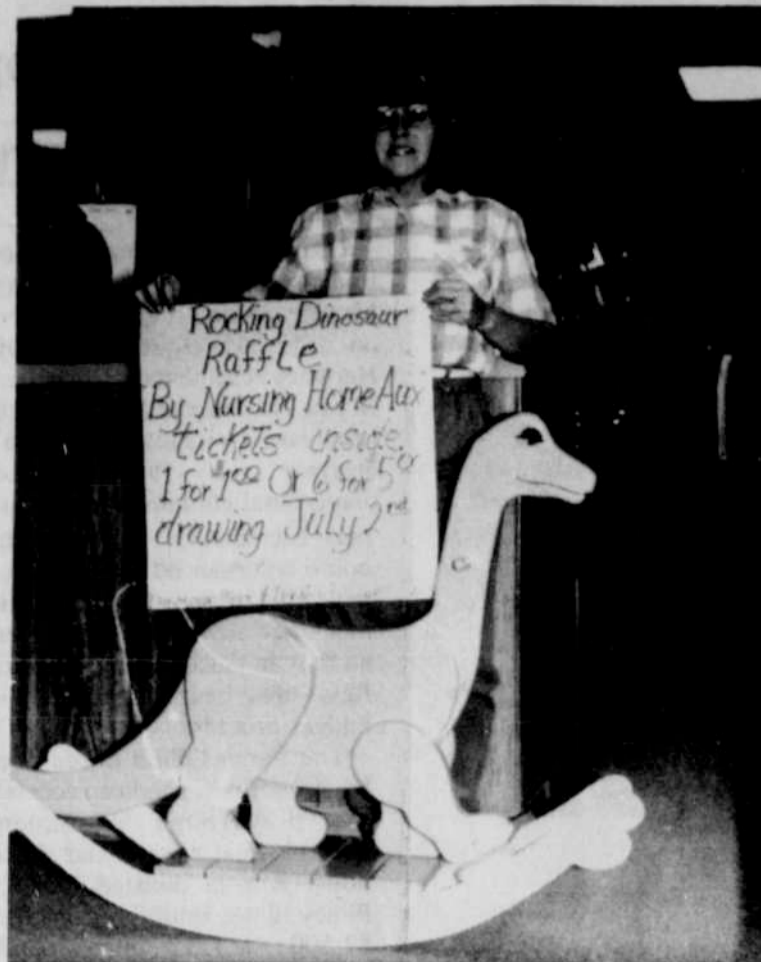

Garden Club offers class

The Heppner Garden Club will offer a six-week six-lesson course in Basic Flower Arranging beginning Tuesday, June 29. The class will be held on Tuesdays from 7 to 9 p.m. until August 3, at the St. Patrick's Senior Center dining room.


