PROPOSES EVALUATION PLANTATION PROJECTS

The Heppner Ranger District of the Umatilla National Forest is currently conducting analysis for the proposed 1993 Forest Stand Fertilization Project. This project is located in Morrow, Grant, and Wheeler counties and would apply, by helicopter, pelletized fertilizer to 11 units covering approximately 648 acres total. Application would be 200 pounds per acre and the active ingredient is nitrogen with added sulphur. These areas have experienced loss of big game cover due to tree defoliation and mortality caused by spruce budworm and bark beetles. Fertilization would stimulate tree growth so that cover for big game would be achieved more quickly than under natural conditions.
