The program will include the following speakers: Bill Broderick, OSU livestock agent, who will speak on body condition scores; Mike Mehrens, Ph.D., nutrition consultant, on basic nutrition and cow nutrition as it relates to calf scours; and Wes Klett, chief executive officer of Anipro, on general nutrition.

The turnout at this clinic will determine if other clinics will be held at this time of year in the future. "This is a very timely topic," said Broderick.
