A story in the July 7 Gazette-Times, concerning an accident in Boardman, involving Morrow County Sheriff's deputy Mark Calbick was incorrect.

Alvaro Orrala-Herrera was eastbound on Kunze Road around 10:05 p.m. on July 3 in Boardman when he veered into the westbound lane and sideswiped a Morrow County patrol car driven by Calbick.
