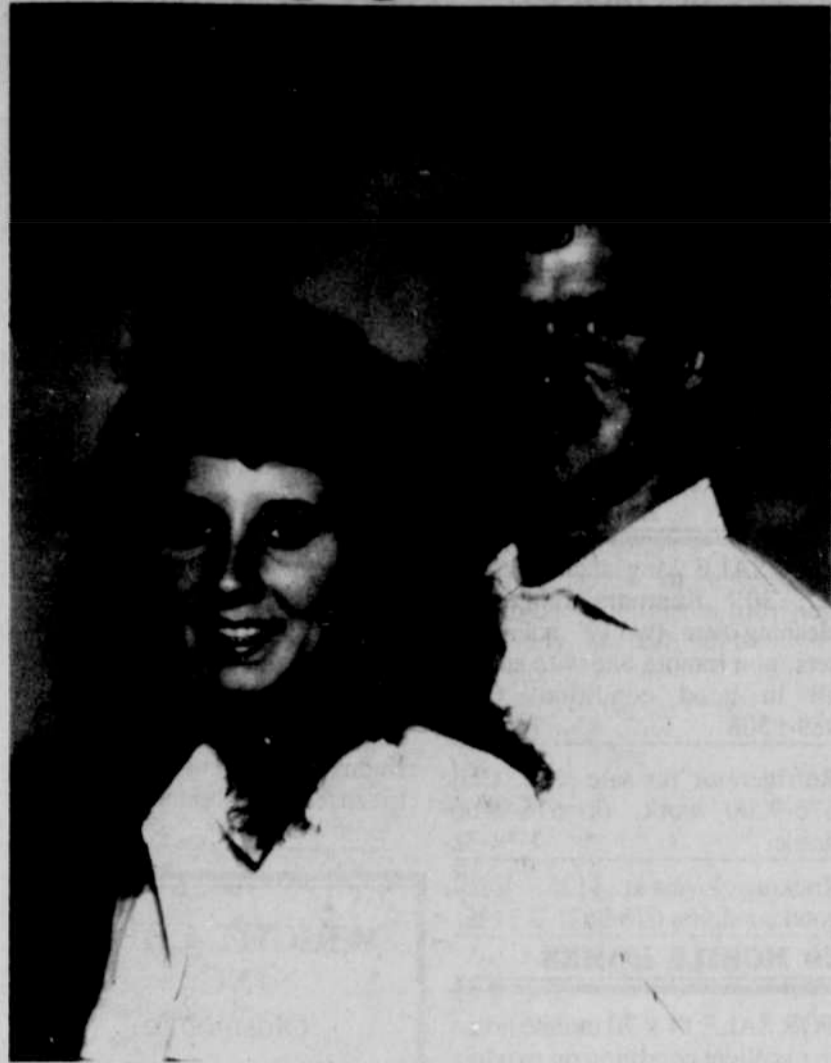


Engagements

SUMMARY STATEMENT OF BASIS FOR CIVIL FORFEITURE

Fox 49 Gives You More Power on Channel 51!

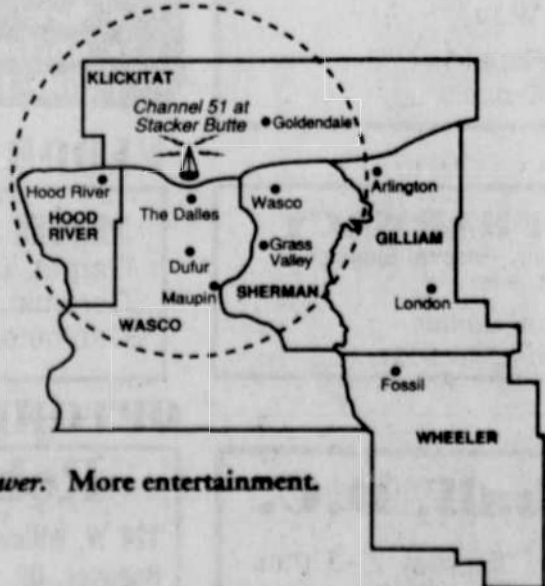
KPDX-TV Fox 49 is now broadcasting on Channel 51 via a more powerful transmitter located on Stacker Butte just north of The Dalles!
