Every other year since 1985 youth from around the world have joined together to celebrate their commitment to the gospel message of Jesus Christ. In 1985 World Youth Day was held in Rome, Italy; in 1987 Buenos Aires, Argentina; 1989 Santiago de Compostela, Spain; 1991 Chestochowa, Poland. The event is expected to draw nearly 200,000 participants from 72 countries and will be attended by Pope John Paul II.

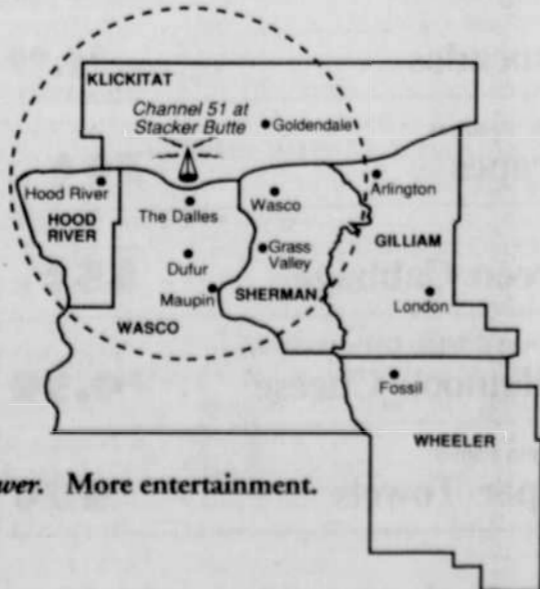
