People have been asking why is the Neighborhood Center of South Morrow County advertising for a full time coordinator in late July early August when they hired someone in February.

The reason is that in January the Neighborhood Center Board of Directors wanted a coordinator for only six months while the board worked on some in house issues concerning the operation of the center and future directions that the Neighborhood Center might explore.

The six month period is over, the board has assessed its situation and so now the position of coordinator is now permanent and full time. The board also felt even though we are pleased with the interim person and that one may reapply for the job, that we ought to open the application process to the public which we are now doing. Application process closes on the 16th of August.

The Neighborhood Center continues to serve the needs of low income persons with food baskets, rental and utility assistance, clothing and a host of other fine programs. We also are in need of donated commercially prepared and packaged food items as our cupboard is very bare.

In conclusion the board of directors of the Neighborhood Center of South Morrow County wishes to express its deepest appreciation to individuals, community organizations, groups and churches that continue to support the work of the center with in kind gifts of donated food, clothing, etc. as well as donated volunteer time and monetary support.
