Nursing home selection OSU publication topic

Ideas about selecting a nursing home that's best for the individual are outlined in a new publication available from the OSU Extension Service.

"Making a Decision About a Nursing Home" contains information about selecting a care facility, helping the individual adjust to new surroundings, and steps that families need to go through when deciding that nursing home care is necessary.

Written by Vicki Schmall, Extension gerontology specialist, and Clara Pratt, director of OSU Gerontology program, the publication points out that families need to identify the family member's present physical and mental condition, share their feelings, assess family resources and involve the relative, other family members and professionals in making the decision.

The authors suggest ways to

evaluate nursing homes by visiting and paying attention to such factors as atmosphere and attitudes of staff and residents, appearance of residents and medical and social services available.

Although the term "nursing home" refers to long-term care facilities providing personal and nursing care to people unable to care for themselves, the information may also be useful when looking at other facilities such as adult foster homes or assisted living facilities, the authors suggest.

"Making a Decision About a Nursing Home" EC 1428, is available for \$1.75 from the Morrow County Extension Service, 430 Heppner/Lexington Highway, Heppner. The publication can also be ordered from Agricultural Communications, OSU Administrative Services A422, Corvallis, OR 97331-2119.
