The Division will forward the coupon to the company with instructions to contact you directly.

If the Division does not receive the coupon WITHIN TWO WEEKS OF THIS PUBLICATION, the company will transfer custody of the unclaimed accounts to the Division. You may still claim the account, but the Division will not send you claim information until AFTER JULY 31, 1994.

The Division publishes notices throughout the state and receives numerous responses, and cannot provide information by telephone. The best way to see if unclaimed assets were reported for you last year, is to fill out the coupon and send it in today.
