Basford has lived his whole life in Ione, graduating from Ione High School in 1990. He played on the East West all star football team that year.

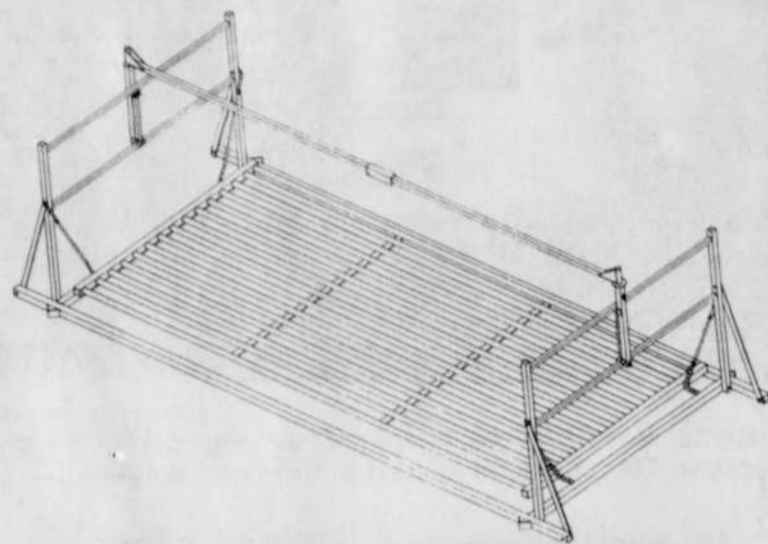
His body work experience includes one year at Carner Chevrolet Auto Body in Pendleton, and two years of auto body schooling at Blue Mountain College.

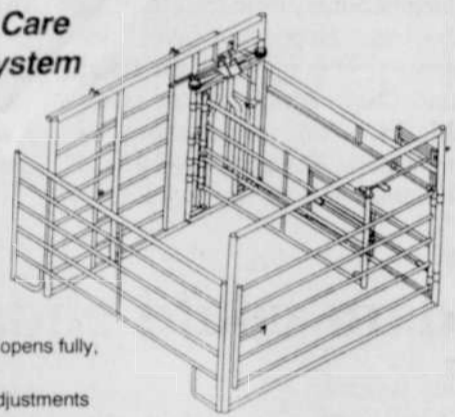

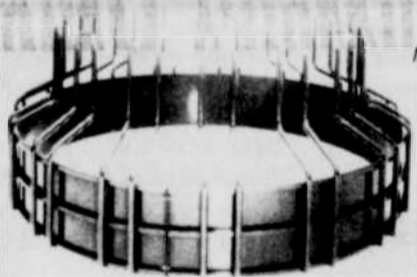

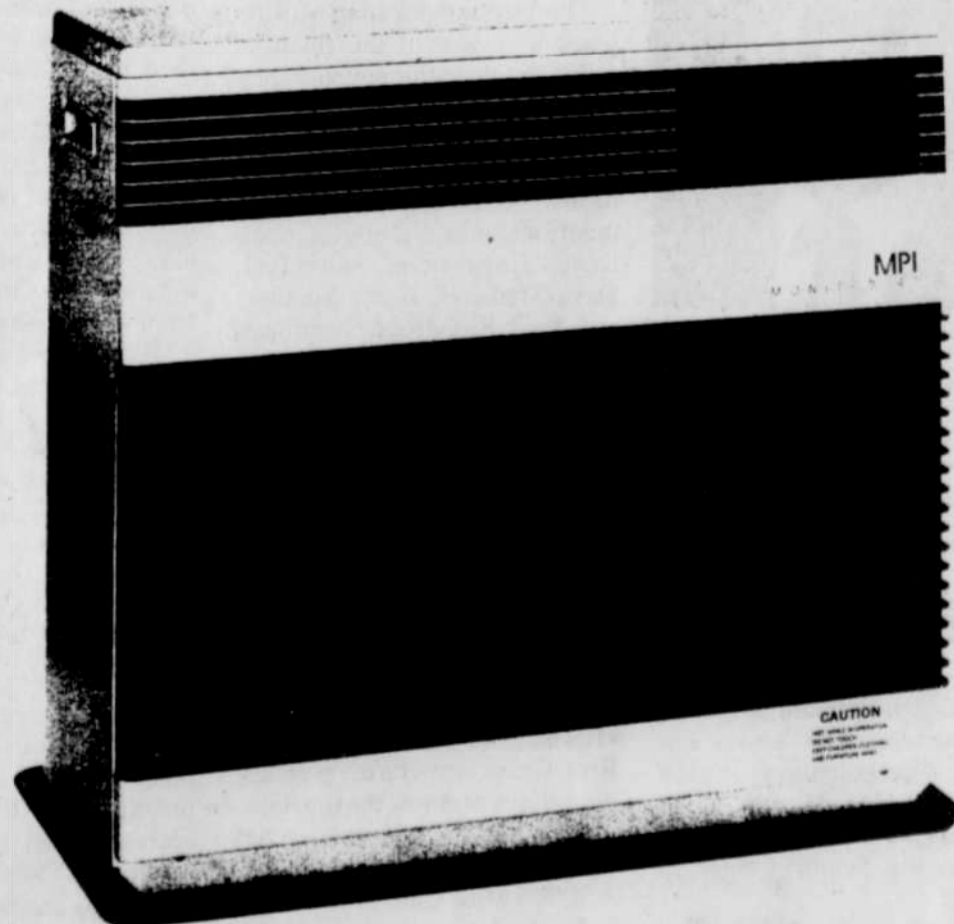
