### Art class wins award

A two and 3-D clay animation video, done by Heppner Junior High seventh and eighth grade students, has won an animation award from the Portland Art Museum Northwest Film Center, HJH art teacher Ron Forrar has announced.

The video will be a part of the 18th annual Young People's Film & Video Festival, a juried survey of media work by elementary and secondary school students from Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana and Alaska, on Sunday, Nov. 7 at 3 p.m. The Festival will be held in the museum's auditorium 1219 SW Park Ave. Admission is free.

"Our young peoples abilities and determination to create a good film paid off in professional recognition this week," said Forrar. "Their film, 'Adventures in Changing The World' was chosen out of over 100 entries as one of the best films created this year in the northwest through the artist-in-residency program," he continued. The film is one out of 28 other entries which have been selected for the public screening.

Students participating in the artist-in-residence workshop were Travis Wilhelm, Jonas Healy, Josie Proctor, Dan Lightle, Adam Doherty, Caleb McDaniel, Josh Coiner, Jim Schlaich, Ben Marvin, Amber Rollis, Shannon Benjamin and Brent Gunderson.

The students were assisted by Sharon Niemczyk, artist-in-residence at Heppner Elementary/Junior High. Niemczyk will be presented the Northwest Film Center's "Service to Young

Film makers Award" in conjunction with the film festival.

"Inaugurated this year, the service award is designed to honor and recognize those members of the community who work to spark, develop, and mentor young talent in the media arts," said a Northwest Film Center news release.

Niemczyk has brought the knowledge, skills and wonder of animation to students throughout Oregon for the past 14 years," the press release said. She has taught physically and emotionally disabled youth at the Oregon State Hospital in Salem, the Bilquist School in Milwaukie, the Waverly Childrens Home, the Parry Center for Children, the Clinton School and the Portland Public Schools' Special Education Program. She has also taught talented and gifted children through such institutions as the Multnomah Education Service District, Portland/Vancouver Saturday Academy, and the Heppner and Hermiston School districts. Bend High School, The Dalles High School and the Open Meadow High School for juvenile offenders have also hosted Niemczyk.

Niemczyk is also a well-known independent animator. She has worked on such music videos as Jim Blashfield's "The Boy In The Bubble" for Paul Simon and "Leave Me Alone" for Michael Jackson. Her active interest in African Cultures, specifically music and dance, will be incorporated into an animated piece that she plans to make in the near future.

Amber Rollis, HHS freshman, was on hand to accept the award before 400 students and their parents.
