

'Scars That Heal' to be shown at Christian Life Center

The film "Scars That Heal", will be shown Dec. 5 at 6 p.m. at the Christian Life Center in Heppner.

The film deals with a young soldier in Vietnam, Dave Roeber, who had over 40 percent of his skin burned off by a grenade exploding in his hand. He went blind in his right eye and deaf in his right ear.

"Roeber's amazing testimony about not only his physical recovery by this emotional and spiritual healing is one of the most dramatic you may ever see or hear," said Tim VanCleave, pastor of the Christian Life Center. "Through the faithfulness of God and the loving support of his wife, Brenda, he has experienced a restoration so complete that his message has been heard around the world a

message that can bring healing for the deep emotionally, mental and spiritual scars tormenting today's generation."

"Scars That Heal" shares this "unforgettable" true story through Dave Roeber's own words. While on the outside, he remains scared from the grenade, he says, "My soul is not scarred. My spirit is not patched together. I'm proud of my scars and stripes. Maybe my life hasn't been easy but these scars tell a story."

"Scars That Heal" is a documentary-style film with dramatic reenactments from World Wide Pictures, the motion picture ministry of the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association.
