Lynn Lundquist

Eastern Oregon cattleman Lynn Lundquist has announced his candidacy for state representative in House District #59.

Lundquist and his wife, Barb, have owned a diversified ranch in Powell Butte since 1976. He managed a large Willamette Valley Co-op prior to that. "I know what it is to meet a payroll, to make those hard decisions that preserve the 'bottom line', and to work towards solutions that enhance both our economy and our environment," Lundquist said as he announced his candidacy for the Republican nomination.

"I have a sense of what makes Oregon 'tick'. My business experience, natural resource background and mature common sense approach to the challenges we all face will enable me to make a positive impact on the values we cherish, personal rights and opportunities, a sound education system, and the opportunity to be gainfully employed while enjoying the quality of life we desire," Lundquist said.

Lundquist received a B.S. from Oregon State college and an M.S. from the University of Connecticut. He taught economics at George Fox College. He says his leadership activities began early in his school years when he served as state FFA president and have continued throughout his adult life. He has served on a local school board, county budget committee and is chairman of the Crook County Planning Commission. He recently was appointed to the state board of agriculture and is currently president of the Oregon Cattlemen's Association.

"It is obvious that all of our lives are influenced a great deal by legislative actions. I'm excited about the opportunity to represent the people of eastern Oregon in the State Legislature and I am willing to give my time and energy to have an effect on the process."

House District #59 encompasses all of Baker, Crook, Grant, Gilliam, Sherman and Wheeler counties plus a portion of Morrow and Wasco.
